TIKEHAU PEARL BEACH RESORT

In the language of the Tuamotu, Tikehau means «peaceful landing». To understand the origins of its name, come visit the Tikehau Pearl Beach Resort, nestled in a wild coconut grove, on a pink sand beach: It awaits you for a stay in paradise.

LOCATION

The Tikehau Pearl Beach Resort is set on Motu Tiano, an islet just 15 minutes away from the village. In the steady breeze of the Trade Winds, 10 acres between ocean and Iagoon, a wild coconut grove fringed by desert, pink sand beaches, unlike any other in French Polynesia.
